DCA and the UNIVERSITY-MODEL®

DCA is a Christ-centered, biblically based, University-Model School® (UMS) dedicated to upholding the importance of family as we partner with committed Christian parents in the education of their children. University-Model schooling was developed as a means of acquiring a high-quality education that helps disciple Christian young people while strengthening the home. This goal is accomplished by offering an academically sound education in a structure that integrates the home and the school in the common enterprise of educating the student both in academics and character.

In a UMS setting, students attend classes three days each week. When students are not in class, they complete work assigned for their home instruction days under the supervision of their parents. The combination of on-campus and off-campus days creates a five day school week for students. The role of the parents during this time ranges from co-instructor/tutor to monitor of independent study. The combined strength of dedicated parents at home, passionate teachers at school, and committed coaches both on and off the field creates an environment in which students thrive and develop a passion for learning, both academically and spiritually.

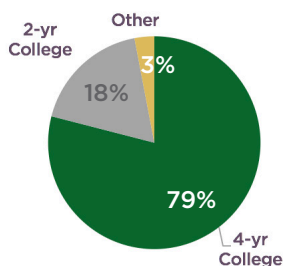
TRANSFER CREDIT POLICY

DCA allows students to transfer coursework in from outside the school for credit. Students are limited to one transfer course per year while enrolled in DCA. Transfer courses must be approved by the Academic Committee and taken from an accredited institution. Credit for these courses is accepted to meet graduation requirements, but DCA is not in a position to validate this course for any other educational institution. Grades from these courses are reported on the transcript and calculated into the student's GPA.

DUAL CREDIT COURSEWORK

Students in their junior and senior year and on a track to graduate may request to take up to two courses per year by dual credit. Currently, North Central Texas College and Texas Woman's University are the approved institutions for dual credit. Students may take only approved equivalent courses to those required at DCA. It is the student's responsibility to fulfill all prerequisites set forth by the college for enrollment (testing, prior coursework, academic standing, etc.). Grades from these courses are reported on the transcript and calculated into the student's GPA.
